

Collaboration



The House Next Door built a great collaboration with the DeLand Police Department. The officer comes in weekly to spend quality time with the students. The officer reads to the children, speaks to them and asks them about their grades and how they are feeling. The kids love the one-on-one time and it creates healthy relationships with the children and the police. Speakers from the community come in and share with students about Sickle Cell Anemia, Asthma Awareness, Volusia County Library, DeLand Police Department, DeLand Fire Department, DeLand Credit Union and Publix. These Community Partners engaged with our students as well as assisting kids with logging on computers and snacks. In addition, the Local Legend Program comes in to learn on the job training and assists with the kids by volunteering. These high school students learned how to engage with the students by assisting with administering meals, public speaking, creating structured lessons and activities for the kids. These young people also provided mentoring and assistance with Reading, Math and Social Engagement.

No Child Left Behind



Overall the funding from United Way made it possible for **Early Learning Coalition of Flagler & Volusia** to effectively screen all children who were enrolled in the childcare center. This process became an integral part of onboarding of families and helped identify needs immediately. Whether that information allowed individualized learning programs or connection of the family with Pediatric Navigation for additional services, ELCFV shares that no child was left behind due to these efforts.

A Breath For Life



A client was being assisted by a **Flagler Cares** Care Coordinator with a disability claim when it was discovered that she needed assistance paying for an oxygen concentrator. She had been unable to make it to her disability appointments due to not being able to leave the house without oxygen. She also had an outstanding balance with her doctor's office that prevented her from being able to make another appointment to obtain the prescription for the oxygen concentrator. Flagler Cares covered her outstanding balance, paid for transportation to her appointments, and covered the cost of the oxygen concentrator after she received her prescription. As a result of the assistance provided through this fund, this client was able to get back on track with attending her disability appointments. She also told the Care Coordinator that, with her new oxygen concentrator, she was finally able to leave the house again which resulted in her being able to attend her grandson's graduation.
